

St. Croix Valley Master Gardeners Grant Applications Being Accepted

St. Croix Valley Master Gardeners Association is now accepting grant applications for gardening projects serving St. Croix or Pierce Counties. <u>The deadline for submission is</u> March 10, 2014.

Each year SCVMGA makes funds available for projects contributing to horticultural education, beautification/improvement of parks and community spaces, dissemination of horticultural information, human services such as growing food for local food shelves, and environmental stewardship such as prairie restoration.

Key criteria considered in awarding the grants are:

- 1) Does the project benefit the public as opposed to private individuals?
- 2) Does the project provide an opportunity for youth to learn about and appreciate horticulture?
- 3) Is this a first time request for grant funds?

SCVMGA requests that grant recipients provide a final summary of their project, with:

Photos of the project by October 1, 2014. Project participants are also encouraged to provide a brief presentation of their project in October or November 2014.

Past projects have included: rain and butterfly gardens created by students and teachers to manage roof runoff; planting of large flower pots to beautify downtown areas; window box plantings at social service organizations; planting of native perennials and woodland plants at various parks; restoration of prairie landscape; assistance in the development of community gardens in various communities; and beautification of park entrances and public buildings with perennials and native plants.


- 2. The **2016 Midwest Regional MG Conference** will be hosted by Wisconsin.

WIMGA name badges can be ordered anytime by certified MGVs, using the form below the link on the WIMGA website. You must be certified and current on hours (recertified) to receive a badge.

There is a \$2.00 charge in addition to cost of badge for individual orders. Dr. Mahr prefers group orders and doesn't place the WIMGA order until she has a large quantity of association and individual orders.

Our group order sign-up is at the January meeting. See Marilyn Gorham, WIMGA rep, at that time to place order and clearly print your name on the order sheet exactly as you want it on your badge. Payment at that time is requested.

The cost is \$6.50 per badge with no additional cost if it is included in the group order. Checks must be made payable to "UW-Horticulture". It may take some time for order to ship.
